DEPARTMENT MATTERS: GENERAL BUSINESS

- **2022 California Fire Code and CPFD Ordinance Changes** (D. Martin, K. Richards) – Review, discuss, and forward to the Board of Directors
 - EA – what are the big things to point out? KR – open burning, some things we don't have but we need to include to be consistent with the rest of the County.
 - KR – change geological, climatic, and cover all the highlights, but no dramatic changes for Cameron Park. ADU's not covered under this code - that's a residential code.
 - EA – asked staff to proceed with the item and take it to the next Board of Director's meeting.
2. **Station 88 facility relocation** (D. Martin) – Review and discuss / not an action item
 - EA – How easy is it to get approximate range for cost on new building? Chief Mike Blankenheim (MB) - we'll get cost estimates from other projects (DM – I think you commented \$2.5M . . . is that correct?)
 - EA – talk to County about expanding our sphere of influence
 - SB – training opportunities? DM – a larger room than 89 has now would allow us to accommodate more trainees/students. More cost effective.
 - EA (directed to chiefs) look into old studies (2020/11, 2014) to see what reports called for.
 - EA – contact property owners (Rite Aid) to see if they are open to discussing with Chiefs and GM (DM says building is not for sale)
 - SB – consider getting a consultant to determine the path forward
 - EA – look to other nearby spots if the two identified spots are not available
 - EA – can you do the research and contact property owners and build a basic budget/cost estimate in time for the next meeting?
 - MB – can put info together and possibly avoid paying for a consultant. EA – think it's important to have a 3rd party present the idea
 - EA – suggests a special meeting in the next couple of months to gather community feedback; study, sites, and consultants

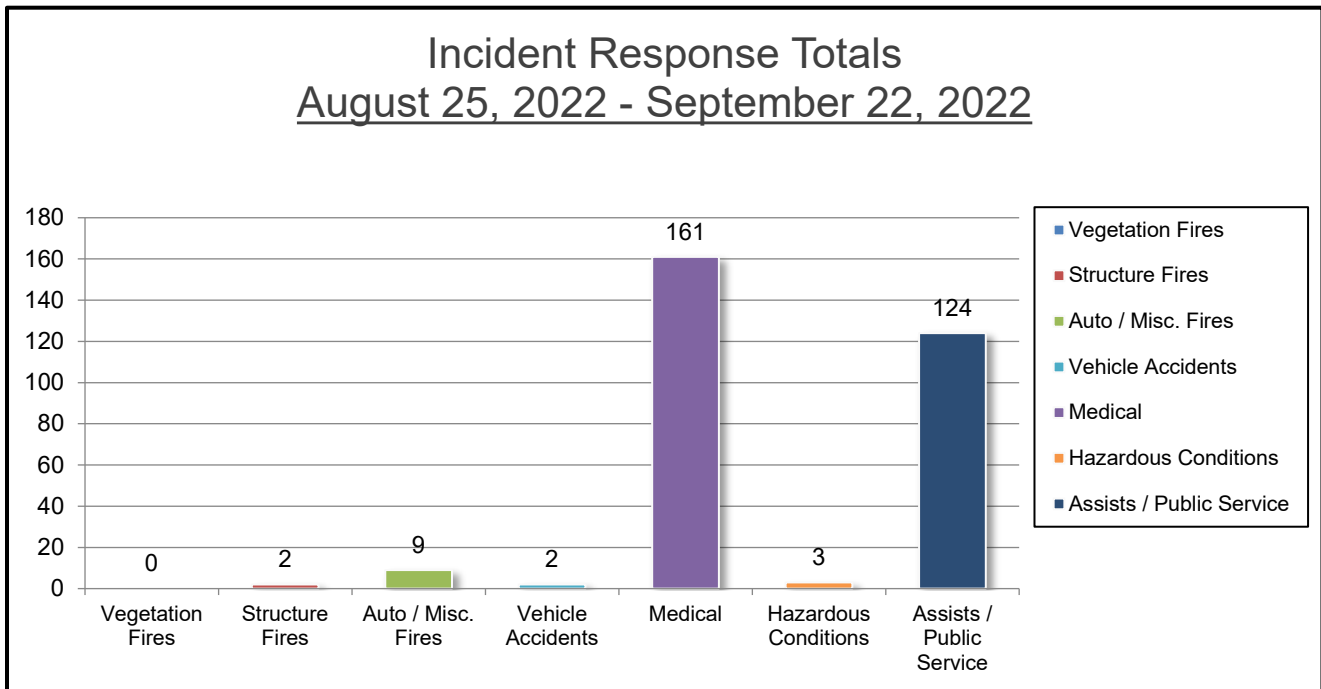

Cameron Park Fire Department Operations and Administration Report

- The District hired Meg Edlund to fill the position of Fire Prevention Specialist. She is currently participating in Fire Code and inspection training with Chief Richards.
- E88 and M89 responded to a traffic accident with a patient that required rapid extrication and immediate ALS treatment. The patient went into cardiac arrest and the Cameron Park Paramedics were able to successfully revive them.
- E389 and E388 have been rented out to CAL FIRE during the Mosquito Fire. These resources have been aiding in local wildland fire protection.



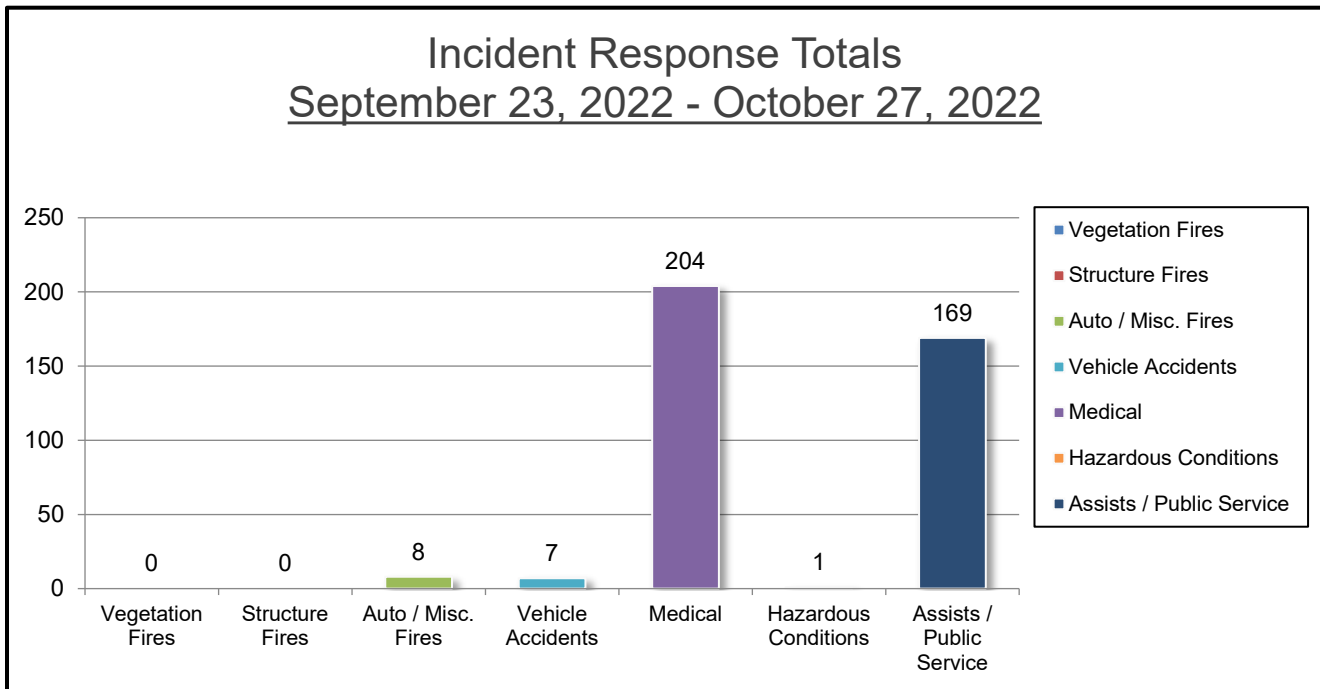
